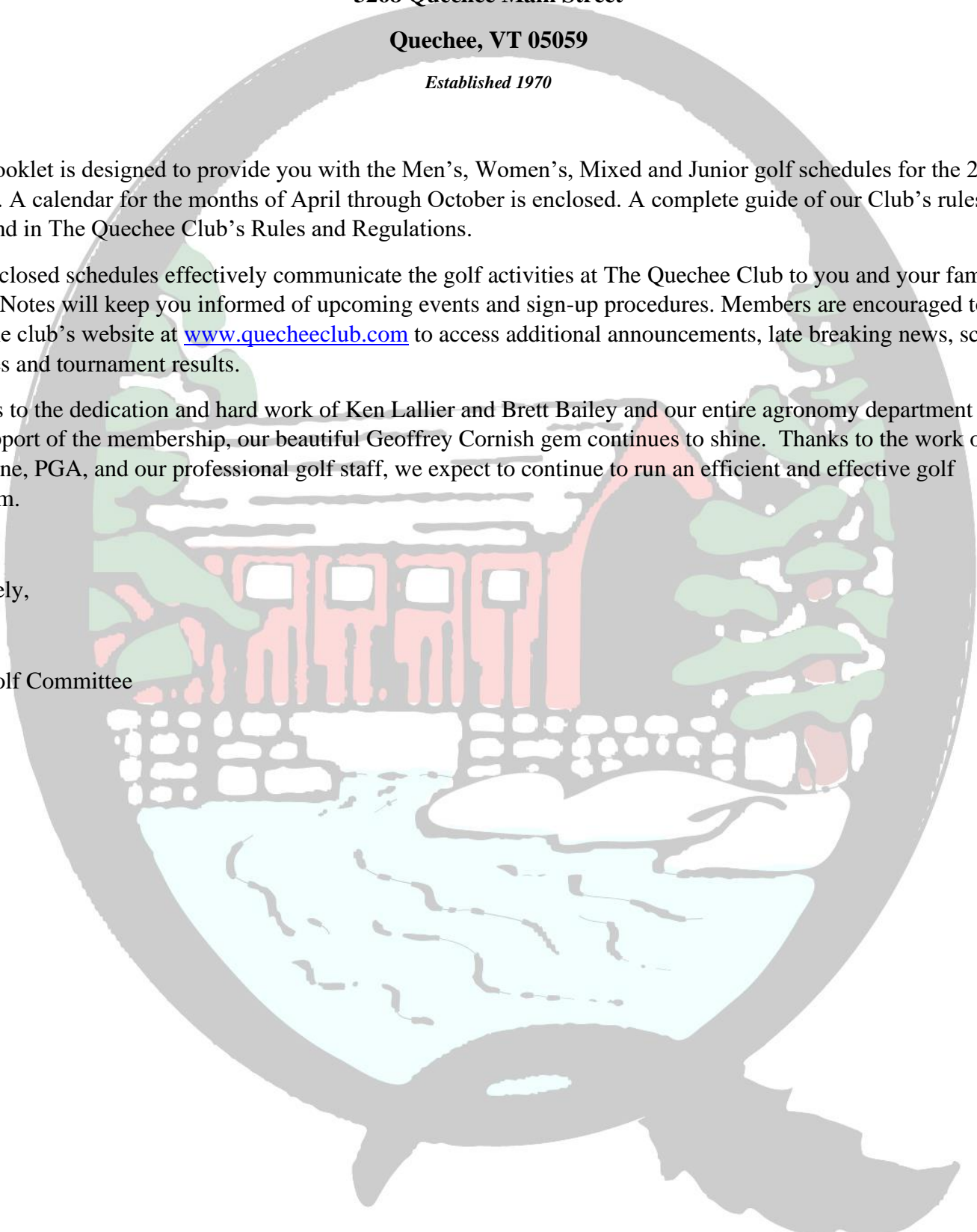

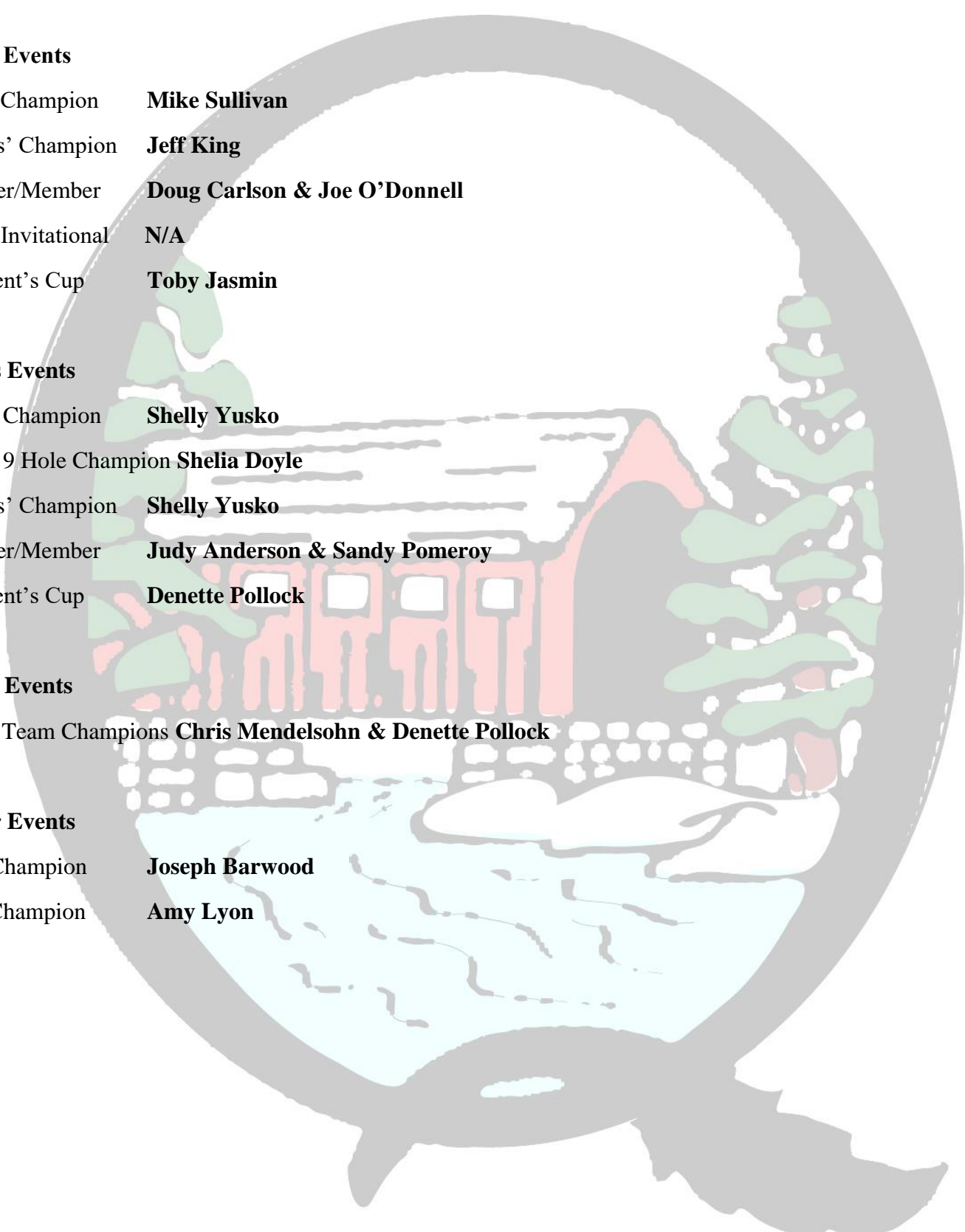

Matters pertaining to tournaments, contests, conduct of players, prizes, golf rules, golf professionals, pro shop staff, golf operations staff, course rangers are controlled and directed by the Golf Committee. The Golf Committee will consider and respond to all suggestions or complaints pertaining to these matters only if they are received in writing.

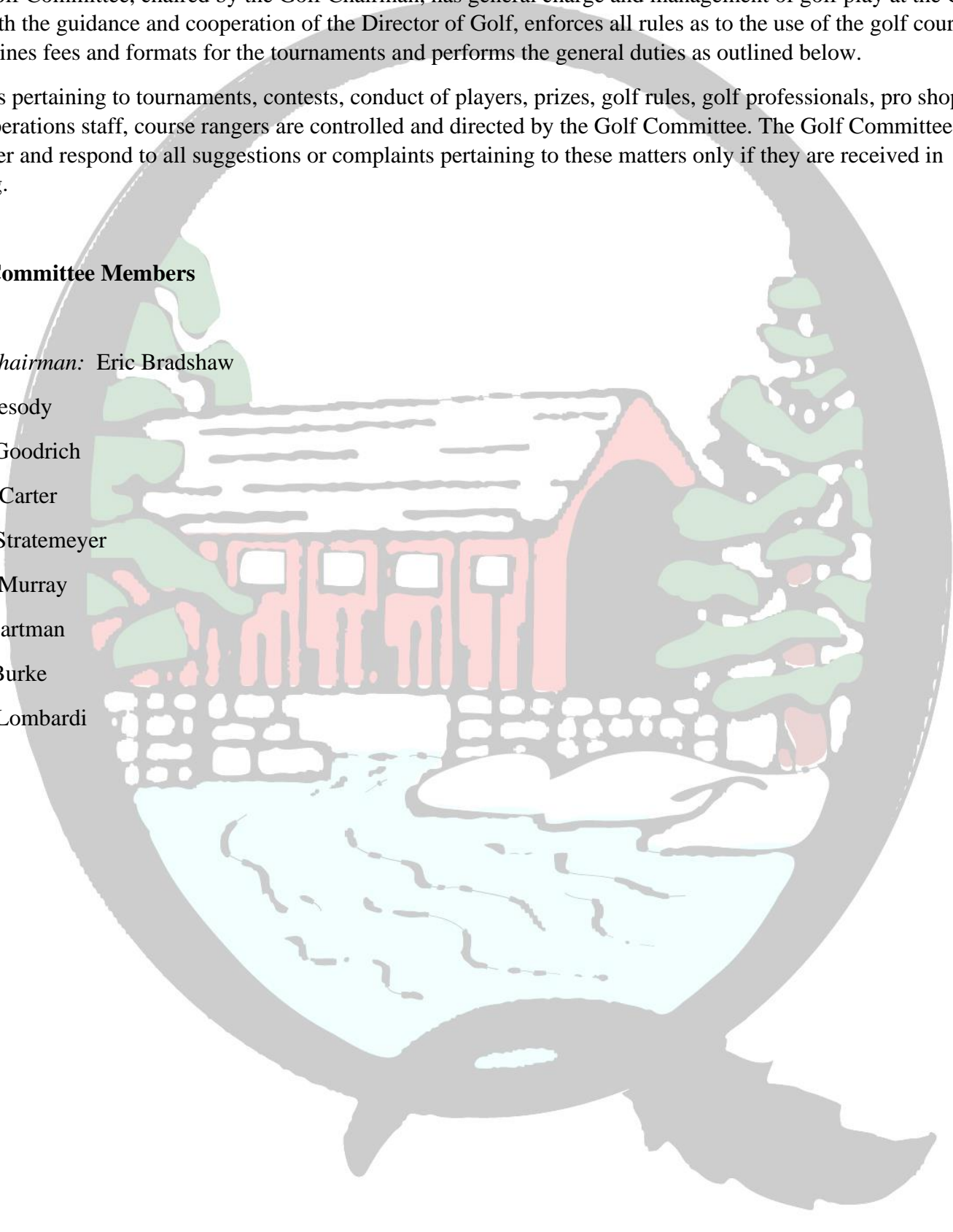

## GREENS COMMITTEE

The goal for the Quechee courses is to have them ranked among the best in Vermont. The Green Committee represents the membership to club management in setting policies, schedules, etc. for the maintenance and use of the golf courses. The committee's primary focus is delivering the best playing surfaces possible – greens, tees, fairways, bunkers, and roughs.

The Committee assists in the development of maintenance standards and long range plans for the courses. Meetings are held monthly and the minutes are posted on the club's website.

While our maintenance staff does an excellent job, Members have a critical role to play in helping the Quechee courses achieve and maintain the best playing conditions possible. Each of us should strive to "leave the course in better shape than we found it."

### **Specific steps you can take are:**

- Repair ball marks on greens
- Repair divots:

-the preferred repair is to replace the grass divot

-on the fairway and on tees, use the seed mix if the divot is not available

-in the rough, replace the grass divot. Do not use the seed mix because it is a different type of grass than we use in our roughs.

- Rake Bunkers: divots and footprints should be smoothed and the rake placed outside the bunker parallel to the direction of play.

Motorized Carts and hand carts put additional stress on the turf. Use common sense to minimize the impact on the playing surfaces and follow these rules:

- Obey all cart signs and verbal directions from the Starter and Rangers.
- Gas/electric carts are not to be driven anywhere beyond the green and white stakes and signs placed near the greens. Drive directly to the cart path when reaching the stakes
- Carts must stay on the cart path always when playing par three holes.
- Minimize damage from motorized carts by avoiding worn and wet areas, steep slopes and bunker surrounds
- Hand carts should not be taken over or parked on greens, fringes or tees.

### **AGRONOMY DEPARTMENT**

The main objective of the Agronomy department at The Quechee Club is to provide the membership with the highest quality playing condition possible, as dictated by the climate and the necessary maintenance practices to be performed.

One of our goals is to minimize disruption to the flow of golf due to course maintenance. Unfortunately, the nature of our business and the restrictions we have on early hour operations because of our residential setting dictate that disruption will happen during play time. During those times when the golfer and grounds crew meet on the course, we ask for your patience. The grounds crew at Quechee is instructed to be courteous and to give the membership the right of way but please realize that the staff is trying to finish tasks as soon as possible so that we inconvenience the fewest number of people. If you allow a staff member to finish his/her task, they will be less likely to interrupt you again during your round.

### **COURSE MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE**

Please note the schedule for course aerification. The aerification process is very disruptive, but it is a necessary evil. Aerification is, without a question, one of the most important cultural practices that we perform each year. It provides relief from compaction caused by foot traffic, increased oxygen exchange with the root mass, increased infiltration rate and a myriad of other benefits to the grass plant. We realize that aerification interrupts an already short Northeast golf season, but it is necessary when providing high quality playing conditions. Thank for your understanding and patience.

### **INCLEMENT WEATHER SYSTEM**

The Club has installed a lightning system for your protection:

**One Long Siren Blast - Clear the golf course immediately and seek shelter**

**Three Short Siren Blasts - Resume Play**

USGA Rules prohibit further play once the lightning warning is in effect.

**The Golf Committee require adherence to this Rule.**

## **GOLF COURTESY**

It is important that members and guests observe the rules of courtesy and etiquette. Slow play and unnecessary delay show a lack of consideration for other players on the course, as does failure to fill divots, rake bunkers and repair ball marks on the greens. The Club insists that its golfers be courteous and observe the correct etiquette on the course. A member is solely responsible for the actions of his or her family and guest. Parents are expected to make their children aware of all rules; children's adherence to the rules is the responsibility of both the parent and child.

## **RULES OF PLAY**

The Golf Committee shall establish the rules of play. It reserves the right to change or eliminate any rules governing play, or to postpone, modify or cancel any event, both at any time.

The Quechee Club encourages golf to be played in foursomes to enhance the spirit of community and to provide the most efficient loading of the golf course. The Director of Golf and his staff have been instructed by the Golf Committee to ensure the proper loading of the golf course during busy times by making up foursomes out of singles, twosomes and threesomes waiting to play. All players shall abide by the instructions issued in this regard by the Director of Golf and his staff. Singles, two and three ball matches have no standing on the golf course. Foursomes have the right of way.

The Director of Golf and his staff will have full authority to determine the order of play, and may at any time start groups in any sequence they deem necessary in order to maintain speed of play and efficient golf operations.

Except where modified by local rules, the Rules of the United States Golf Association shall govern play at all times.

All players must report to the Golf Shop and/or Starter Shack prior to the start of their golf round.

All play shall commence from the first tee. Starting from any other tee may be allowed by permission of the professional staff.

All matches are required to maintain their Proper Position on the golf course. Please familiarize yourself with TQC's Pace of Play Policy.

Cutting in is not permitted. All holes are to be played in sequence.

To preserve the beauty and condition of The Quechee Club, members must repair all ball marks, rake bunkers and replace all divots.

All members with golf privileges will be issued tags for their golf bags. In addition, all members of their families entitled to the use of the course will receive tags. These tags must be clearly displayed at all times. If lost, they will be replaced by the golf professional staff.

## **INFRACTIONS**

Violations shall be reported to the Director of Golf and to the Golf Chairman for appropriate action. The Golf Chairman shall discuss violations with the Golf Committee, which shall determine and enforce appropriate disciplinary actions. Serious or repeated infractions may be referred to the Grievance Board for further disciplinary actions.

## **ELECTRONIC YARDAGE DEVICES**

Electronic yardage devices are sanctioned for use in all tournament play.

## **CELLULAR PHONES & WIRELESS DEVICES**

The use of wireless communications devices, including cell phones and Bluetooth Speakers are permitted but should not interfere with other members on the golf course or common areas.

## **GOLF MEMBERS**

All property owners within the Quechee Lakes master plan are obligated by their deed to be dues paying members of the Quechee Lakes Landowners' Association, Inc., the legal entity which owns and operates the amenities and campus of The Quechee Club. There is no distinction between members as may be found in typical country clubs, where there are 'golf members' or 'house members' or 'associate members.' Instead, each property owner and their spouse, along with any unmarried children younger than 23, are considered Members. Members may use the facilities on a season-pass basis, an a la carte basis, or a combination of both. Members who have purchased a season's pass for golf are referred to as full golf members. Golf members have certain privileges with respect to tee times and guests.

***FAMILY GUEST*** is defined as "All members of the lineal family of the Active Member and Co-Member, including children older than 23 years, parents and grandchildren, are Family Guests and, as determined by the Board of Trustees, may be accorded lower usage fees than other guests."

## **TEE TIME ACCESS/GUEST PLAY • 2021**

### **QLLA GOLF MEMBERS:**

- 8-day advance tee times. Holiday weekends are the exception to the rule when the "holiday" itself falls on a Monday, access will be inclusive of that day.
- Guest Play: Three guests may accompany Golf members.
- Unaccompanied Guest: Please contact The Golf Pro Shop for any unaccompanied guest play.

### **QLLA NON-GOLF MEMBERS**

- 5-day advance tee times.
- Guest Play: Three guests may accompany Non-Golf members.

### **QLLA LEGACY GOLF MEMBERS**

- 5-day advance tee times.
- Guest Play: Three guests may accompany Legacy members.

## **QLLA ASSOCIATE MEMBERS**

- 8-day advance tee times.
- Three guests may accompany Associate Package holders.

## **RENTERS**

- 3-day advance tee times.

Rain checks: Refunds will be given on a pro-rated basis on the number of holes played. If fewer than 3 holes are played - full refund, if more than 9 holes are played, no refunds.

## **MEMBER RUN GROUPS**

All tee times for Groups will be entered by the pro shop staff. 9 Days out you will need to email your tee time requirements to [tj.anthoine@quecheeclub.com](mailto:tj.anthoine@quecheeclub.com). Your request should include the total number of tee times you will need for the specific day you are referring to. 6 Days out, you will need to add names to your tee times, emailed to the same address. 5 days out, your total allotment of tee times will be adjusted based on the names submitted as the TBD's will be eliminated. Those eliminated tee times will be released to the membership at that time. Names of the players and pairings for each group are expected to be delivered to the golf shop 2 days prior to the date of play, (i.e Thursday for Saturday tee times), This will ensure an accurate tee sheet and the proper names of players playing that day.

Weekends with club run tournaments will still call for modification of the policy. The weekends when one course is closed for a club organized event, the groups will not be given tee time blocks and will have to reserve their own tee times.

The same email process applies whether for weekend play or during the week. Your existing group play times will not change during the week. We anticipate remaining flexible and will adjust as necessary going forward. We will also begin referring members to groups as per any requirements each group installs. Below is the list of Member Run Group with contact information, dates and times of play and handicap range. If you have any further questions regarding the group, please contact TJ Anthoine.

## **GOLF CART RULES AND REGULATIONS**

**\*\* Golf cart driver must be 16 years of age and present a valid driver's license to operate a golf cart on the golf courses\*\***

Applicable cart fees apply.

## **PRIVATE GOLF CARTS**

- Private golf cart owners are required to obey the same rules as anyone renting a golf cart.
- No private golf cart may be owned by more than one family.
- No more than two riders per cart except for carts specifically designed for four passengers when being used for transportation not related to use of the golf course.
- Private golf cart owners are not permitted to loan or rent their golf carts to anyone other than a spouse or an unmarried child under the age of 23 at the start of the membership year. When there are more than two golfers in a family membership, two should be designated to use the private cart. In such situations, additional family members must pay applicable cart fees.
- All private carts must be registered at Membership Services, with the owner showing proof of insurance, prior to being allowed on the golf course each year. A registration sticker will be provided.



- The Trail Fee for private golf carts includes gasoline. Electricity is provided with storage.
- Owner's identification sticker must be placed on the vehicle's passenger's side front fender for access to the golf amenities refueling.
- Owners are responsible for the pickup and return of their golf cart to the storage area.
- All maintenance of private golf carts performed by QLLA personnel shall be billed to the individual golf cart owner. Towing fees will be charged if golf carts must be towed.
- All private golf carts will be provided with two seed bottles that must be present on the cart and used as required whenever the carts are on the courses. New owners should contact the golf maintenance department to schedule installation of seed bottles (802-295-7488).
- Recreational non-golf private carts **must register** with Membership Services.
- Prior to any Private cart purchase, please contact the golf pro shop to ensure your purchase meets QLLA standards.

### **HOLE IN ONE**

The Hole-in-One Fund is available to all members. Golf members will be automatically billed on their house account. Non-Golf members can sign up for the fund in The Golf Shop. If a member in the fund makes a hole-in-one during a regular 18-hole round or in a 9-hole tournament, they must have their score card attested by a player they are playing with and verified by the Director of Golf. Temporary greens are excluded.

The celebration consists of a free drink for all adult golfers at the Clubhouse (up to \$500 maximum) courtesy of the Hole-in-One Fund. The \$500 fund can be spent two different ways, option 1, all \$500 of the fund spent in the bar. Option 2 spend \$250 in the bar and \$250 in pro shop credit. This decision must be made immediately following the round. The bar will begin serving when the player who made the hole in one is brought to the bar by the professional staff confirming the feat. The golfer may elect to postpone the celebration to anyone of the following five days.

### **PACE OF PLAY**

All players are responsible for maintaining a proper pace of play.

Under normal playing conditions a round of golf should be completed in approximately four (4) hours. If a group is not maintaining the pace of play, the ranger will request that the group pick up the pace of play and maintain a proper position on the golf course, which is one or two shots behind the next group. If, after requesting the group to pick up the pace of play and they remain out of position, the ranger will move the group ahead one hole to speed up play.

Groups that cannot keep pace will be given an opportunity to improve their position on the golf course once the breach has been discovered.

#### *First Warning*

- A ranger will approach them and ask the entire group to please try to catch the group in front of them. The group will be informed from a time perspective how much they are behind.
- The group will have two holes to make the corrective action, and at that time either the ranger will let them know that they have achieved an acceptable pace, or the ranger will call the golf pro shop for assistance in moving the group.

- The ranger will closely monitor the group until they are back in position.
- The ranger will also inform the entire group that the golf pro shop has been informed of the pace breach and that the group is in danger of being moved to the next teeing ground, and if the group cannot improve their position after the verbal warning, the ranger will radio the golf pro shop for assistance.
- Once a Golf Professional arrives on the scene, the entire group must pick up their golf balls and move to the proper position on the golf course based on 13.5 minutes per hole.

### Pace of Play Expectations

Please be guided by the following pace of play recommendation **Lakeland**

Time Allowance is 13 1/2 Minutes Per Hole. The following chart is the maximum time, past your tee time, to complete the number of holes:

- 3 holes: 40 minutes
- 6 holes: 1 hr. 20 minutes
- 9 holes: 2 hrs.
- 12 holes: 2 hrs. 40 minutes 15 holes: 3 hrs. 23 minutes 18 holes: 4 hrs. 3 minutes

### **Highland**

Time Allowance is 14 Minutes Per Hole. The following chart is the maximum time, past your tee time, to complete the number of holes:

- 3 holes: 42 minutes
- 6 holes: 1 hr. 24 minutes
- 9 holes: 2 hrs. 10 minutes
- 12 holes: 2 hrs. 48 minutes 15 holes: 3 hrs. 30 minutes 18 holes: 4 hrs. 20 minutes

### **STARTERS & RANGERS**

The starters and rangers have the responsibility and authority to maintain efficient play and enforce the rules and policies. They are not to be verbally abused and their directives must be followed. Golf privileges may be curtailed or suspended for violations of these provisions in accordance with the by-laws of the association.

### **STARTERS**

The Starter administers and coordinates the orderly and efficient start of play on both courses.

The Starter implements the daily tee time list. If a player or players do not report to the Starter prior to their tee time or are late for their tee time, the Starter will instruct the next group to proceed. The late group will be required to wait for the next available tee time. Twosomes will be permitted at the discretion of the golf professional staff.

The Starter is responsible for reciting rules and policies of the day.

The Starter will collect copies of all greens fees and golf cart receipts, and return them to The Golf Shop that day.

### **RANGERS**

Rangers are responsible for the interpretation and enforcement of all rules, regulations and policies.

The ranger patrols the two courses on a regular basis. He or she is responsible for keeping play moving (see Pace of Play policy), assisting first time players in finding their way around the courses and ensuring readiness for medical emergencies.

Upon review by the professional staff, the ranger is empowered to remove from the golf courses any player or group of players who refuses to comply with the rules of the golf courses, policies and golf cart rules. The Marshal may request the assistance of a Golf Professional to adjudicate any dispute.

## **PRACTICE AREAS**

Guests may use the practice facilities only in preparation for a guest round of golf to be played on that same day.

The practice areas are available for use by all QLLA Members.

Members are expected to limit their use of the practice tee to a reasonable time when other members are waiting.

Juniors, ages 14-17, may use the Driving Range unaccompanied only if certified to do so by a TQC Golf Professional or when participating in Quechee's Junior Golf programs.

Juniors, ages 5-13, may use the Driving Range if accompanied by an adult who must remain at the facility and supervise the child for the entire time. The adult is responsible for the actions of the child.

A child under the age of 5 cannot use the Driving Range and cannot accompany an adult who is using the range.

All Juniors must yield their spot on the Range to any adult golfer waiting for a spot when all hitting spots are taken.

## **DRIVING RANGE - HOURS OF OPERATION**

**OPEN DAILY: 6:30AM – 7:00pm**

**EXCEPTIONS: MONDAYS & THURSDAYS: Opens @ 8:30AM (For Range mowing)**

**SUNDAYS & WEDNESDAYS: Closes @ 5:30pm (For clean pick)**

### **Mowing Schedule:**

- **Tee Tops:** Monday & Thursday - 6:00AM – 8:30AM
- **Range:** Mondays & Thursdays – 6:00AM – 8:30AM (Range opens @ 8:30AM)

### **Watering Schedule:**

- **Daily Afternoon Watering: 12:30PM – 1:00PM**
  - Tees closed during this time
  - Automatic irrigation will come on
  - Weather dependent

## **HITTING AREA ROTATION:**

- **MONDAY: MATS ONLY**

- (All Turf areas closed, including upper tees)
- **TUESDAY, THURSDAY, SATURDAY: TURF AREAS ONLY**
  - (Upper & Lower tees)
  - (Some mat stations may be available, based on where turf tee locations are)
- **WEDNESDAY, FRIDAY & SUNDAY: MATS & UPPER TEES ONLY**

It is the TQC Golf Staff's responsibility to ensure that all members are using the range in a safe and responsible manner.

### **DRESS CODE**

**Golf:** Appropriate attire on the golf course, practice range and putting green is required.

#### **Men's and Boys' Appropriate Attire:**

- Collared shirts. Mock turtlenecks are acceptable.
- Shirts must be tucked in.
- Slacks or Bermuda-length shorts. If there are beltloops, belts must be worn.
- Hats worn with brim facing forward.

#### **Ladies' and Girls' Appropriate Attire:**

- Conventional golf shirts and dress tee shirts.
- Shirts must have a collar or sleeves.
- Slacks or Bermuda-length shorts or skirts. Shorts and skirts must fall no higher than 4" above the knee. If there are beltloops, belts must be worn.

***Unacceptable Attire on the Golf Course:*** For *all* players and their guests:

- clothing with offensive language or designs
- jeans of any color, cargo shorts or cargo pants, short shorts, tennis shorts or bathing suits,
- tank tops, halter tops and racer backs are not considered suitable.

## **CLUB STORAGE**

Included in the seasonal fee will be personalized name labels on all clubs and umbrellas, and a discount on all club repairs. Request a set of labels from any member of the staff in the pro shop and allow a day for their preparation. Golf Season Pass Holders will be provided with a bag tag that must be displayed when using the courses.

QLLA is not responsible for the loss of clubs, golf equipment, or the contents of any golf bag stored or used on QLLA property. Each member should check with his personal insurance agent with respect to coverage for any such loss.

## **HANDICAP POLICY**

The Handicap Committee will be responsible for the review of all posted scores.

1. Quechee Club Golf Handicaps are maintained in accordance with the rules of the official USGA Handicap System and are monitored regularly by the Handicap Committee and the Head Golf Professional.
2. Under USGA Rules, **it is still the responsibility of the player to post his/her score to determine an accurate and current handicap unless stated otherwise from the Professional staff.**
3. Upon completion of play, each player is **required** to post a **valid** score in the GHIN system. Scores are collected during the **active golf season from April 15th thru October 31st**. A valid score at our courses, as defined by the USGA, is recording at least 7 completed holes for 9 holes and at least 14 holes for 18 holes on your own ball and using Net Double Bogey scoring for any unplayed holes – unless it is determined by the Golf Professional and the greens Superintendent that the course is not fit for recording valid scores due to unplayable course conditions.
4. In posting scores, players must utilize the USGA's "**Net Double Bogey**" process. Instructions for converting scores using this process are posted at the Golf Shop or by using the GHIN App on your mobile device. Please take the time to review this process and post an adjusted score in accordance with your handicap.
  1. example: Double Bogey +/- any handicap strokes received on a hole (minus applies to plus – handicap players)
    1. **\*\*If you post hole – by – hole scores, the Net Double Bogey adjustment should be applied automatically.**
5. **Only players with an established current handicap are eligible to participate in competitive club events including all tournaments.** A current handicap is defined as a score posted during the active golf season – with a minimum of **five** 18 hole scores required. The end of the season handicap will be considered a valid handicap to start the following year, until valid scores are posted for the new golfing season.
6. **Regular random checks will be made by the Pro and the Handicap Committee to assure that players are signing in and posting scores.** If a player fails to post an acceptable score as soon as practical after completion of the round, the Handicap Committee has three options: 1) Post the actual score made by the player; 2) Post a penalty score equal to the lowest Handicap Differential in the scoring record; 3) Post the

actual score and a penalty score. The Handicap Committee is not required to notify the player prior to posting a penalty score.

7. Handicap and slope system conversion cards are posted at the Pro Shop, Starter Shack and on the GHIN App on your mobile device for your reference. The slope system also factors into the conversion of scores based on the tees used during the round.
8. Scores from other courses, either locally or from out of town played any time of year, should be posted in accordance with the slope and index of the course played and the date the round was played – when the handicap season is on and active during the regular golfing season.
9. The Golf/Handicap Committee (need to define) has the right to adjust handicaps, if necessary, in consultation with the Head Golf Professional. Handicaps and the enforcement of their accuracy fall under the authority of the Golf/Handicap Committee.(need to define)
10. For tournament play, it is the responsibility of the Head Golf Professional to certify the accuracy and legitimacy of any player’s handicap and their eligibility for play in an event, by utilizing all the resources of the handicap computer to insure and validate their posted scores. This process has been ongoing and will assure the accuracy and current status of each handicap.
11. Members who participate in more “social” events such as, but not limited to, **Captain & Crew and Nine & Dine** or some Couples events are still required to post scores – **when valid** – as described in Rule #4. However, those groups will still have the autonomy to structure their own events as they so choose, aware that the ultimate authority for handicap verification still rests with the Golf/Handicap Committee.(need to define)

**These updates to the existing “Handicap Rules” are being implemented to assure legitimate and accurate handicaps for all play at the Club and to promote the honesty and integrity of golf among the playing members at The Quechee Club.**

### **Men’s and Ladies’ Sanctioned Tournaments (For Handicap Purposes)**

Men’s Events: Member/Member, President’s Cup, Men’s Invitational, Men’s Club Championship, Senior Men’s Club Championship, Medal Play Championship.

Ladies’ Events: Member/Member, President’s Cup, Women’s Club Championship, Senior Women’s Championship

The list of sanctioned tournaments may change, without prior notice, subject to approval by the Golf Committee.

### **TOURNAMENT POLICIES**

*Please call the Golf Shop to enter and remember that it is your responsibility to confirm your entry, so follow up personally.* Members using any web-based, email or other electronic tournament registration should receive a registration confirmation with 24 hours. If such confirmation is not received, the member should assume that he is not registered and call the pro shop staff immediately.

For team events, the Golf Staff will only accept entries from participants who sign up as a team. Members may not hold an entry in the tournament roster without a partner. Any team member that loses his partner after registering will have 48 hours to replace that partner. After 48 hours, he will be removed from the roster until he finds another partner.

Each tournament flyer will contain the precise date when tournament sign up can commence and when open slots will begin to be offered to those on the waiting list.

### **Tournament Pace of Play Policy:**

#### **1. Pace of Play**

All members of The Quechee Club are required to maintain their proper position on the golf course and to play without Undue Delay. The Golf Committee defines a group's Proper Position to be (a) directly behind the group in front of them, or (b) to be within the Allotted Time to Play.

The first group or lead group will be considered Out of Position and in violation of the Pace of Play Policy if, at any point during their round, their group is behind the Allotted Time to Play. If the first group or lead group is playing within the Allotted Time to Play, their Pace of Play will be considered satisfactory.

The position of the group behind has no bearing in determining whether a groups' Pace of Play is satisfactory.

### **TOURNAMENT POLICIES (Continued)**

#### **2. Timing**

A player will have 30 seconds to play a stroke when being timed.

Timing of a player's stroke will begin when it is his turn to play and he can play without interference or distraction. Any time spent determining yardages, club selection and discussions with his partner or caddie will count as time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, timing will begin after a player has been allowed a reasonable amount of time to mark, lift, clean and replace his ball, repair his ball mark and other ball marks on his line of putt and remove loose impediments on the line of his putt.

NOTE: An extra 10 seconds will be allowed for:

- A. The first player to play a stroke on a par-3 hole.
- B. The first player to play a second stroke on a par-4 or par-5 hole.
- C. The first player to play a third stroke on a par-5 hole.
- D. The first player to play on or around the putting green.

#### **3. Penalties – Penalty Phase**

Any player in a group that is deemed Out of Position, will be subject to being timing and may be penalized. Any

player who exceeds the allotted time (30 seconds) to play a stroke will be notified of such. Any player that has received notification of a bad time is considered to be in the Penalty Phase of the Pace of Play Policy. Players in the Penalty Phase of the Pace of Play Policy will be penalized in the following manner:

## **TOURNAMENT POLICIES (Continued)**

### **4. Summary of Penalties during a Round**

#### **Stroke Play**

First Offense: Exceeded the Allotted Time to Play a stroke – warning.

Second Offense: Exceeded the Allotted Time to Play a stroke – one stroke penalty on the hole of the offense.

Third Offense: Exceeded the Allotted Time to Play a stroke – two stroke penalty on the hole of the offense.

#### **Match Play**

First Offense: Exceeded the Allotted Time to Play a stroke – warning.

Second Offense: Exceeded the Allotted Time to Play a stroke – one stroke penalty on the warned player on the hole of the offense.

Third Offense: Exceeded the Allotted Time to Play a stroke – team penalty Loss of Hole.

**Note: In the administration of this Pace of Play guideline, no member of the TQC Golf Staff shall be subjected to any form of abuse by competitors.**

**Complaints of any nature should be brought to the attention of the Golf Committee.**

**All infractions or violations of the Tournament Pace of Play Policy will be brought to the attention of the Golf Committee**

#### **Discrepancies:**

In the event of discrepancies among the Club Handbook, Golf Tournament Flyers, Golf Tournament Rule Sheets and this Golf Handbook, the rules in the Handbook shall take precedence unless it is noted along with the difference that it was specifically intended to countermand club rules on the issue.

## **JUNIOR GOLF PROGRAMS**

Children under 12 years old may not play until after 12:00 p.m. unless authorized by the professional staff.

On weekends and holidays, before 2:00 p.m., junior players 12 to 16 years of age may play with a parent, but only two junior players per foursome are permitted.

The Quechee Junior Golf program in 2021 will be expanding.... again! Our goal going into this season was to not only offer more instruction, but to offer more playing opportunities going forward. Structured league and Junior Mentor Golf will highlight this season, as well as actual tee times secured for just “fun” golf for all to enjoy.

We will be implementing a new Junior Bag Tag System this year. The Bag Tag System is a check point for the juniors to initially have an opportunity to be a part of the program, but also used as a tool to allow them to use the facilities within the Club’s guidelines. The Golf Staff introduces these regulations to the children, but the primary responsibility of ensuring they are followed lies with the parent. The check points allow the Junior to eventually play and practice without an adult.

The Appropriate Bag Tag must always be visible when the junior is using any of the golf facilities which includes the range, putting green, and the golf courses. A junior may be asked by an adult member of the club or member of the golf staff to cease using the golf facilities until they can show and display their bag tag.

## Advanced

### Privileges:

### Requirements:

- Must be 13 years of age or approved by the Golf Professional
- Complete Intermediate Bag Tag requirements.

- Demonstrate maturity, pace of play and playing ability necessary for the 18 hole course
- Playing test includes analysis of independent skills, speed of play proficiency, and observance of rules and etiquette. Play the golf course with an adult or junior mentor and record pace of play.
- Pay appropriate club fees for use of facilities

**Note:** A Junior's bag tag is a privilege and can be reduced or suspended by the Golf Staff or Golf Committee if conduct is unbecoming our Junior Golf Program.
