

A fiscal sponsorship is an arrangement in which one entity (usually with 501(c)3 designation) agrees to accept and manage funds for another (usually a small, grassroots-type group without 501(c)3 designation) for a related charitable purpose and for a specified amount of time. The fiscal sponsor extends use of its Tax ID number and process for collecting donations on behalf of the smaller group.
